A Dangerous Goods Safety Advisor (DGSA) is a person certified to provide advice on chemical organization activities of Consignment, Carriage, Packing, Loading, Storage, Blending, Filling or Loading/Unloading of Dangerous Goods; to monitor compliance with legal requirements and to ensure the preparation of an annual report; and to assess the risks of transporting dangerous goods and help prevent these risks for the organization concerned. The Agreement Concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR) mandates that these organisations must appoint a DGSA. This globally recognized certification is essential for ensuring safety and compliance in all operations involving dangerous goods

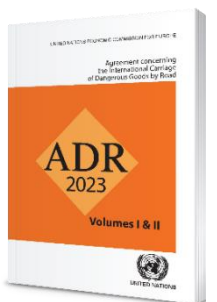
Examinations & Assessments

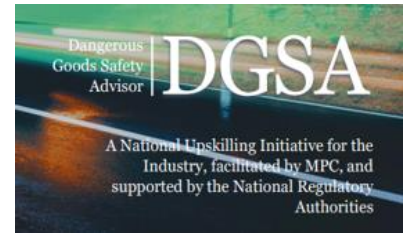
